Each trip, 50% of our time is spent helping people in need by painting and doing minor repairs to their homes. Do you have any allergies or physical limitations that would keep you from working on the ministry projects? If so please explain. _____

Room Arrangements

Rooms are normally reserved with double occupancy. Do you have a spouse or partner you will be rooming with? Please list the person's name _____. If you do not have a spouse or partner we will try to place you with another person. If that is not possible you will be charged a single occupancy rate. If you prefer to room alone single occupancy is possible – but with an added charge (total cost for single room is \$3,500). Please contact us if you wish to room alone.

Trip Cost

A non-refundable deposit of \$100.00 is required at time of registration. The cost of the trip, \$3,100 (\$3,500 for single room occupancy) (which includes your deposit), covers airfare from JFK Airport, New York to Tel Aviv, Israel, hotel accommodations in Israel, ground travel while in Israel, two meals a day and a small portion of the work supplies. **(Does not include any extra charge the airlines might add such as gasoline surcharge. If a last minute surcharge is added to the airfare we inform you of the additional cost as soon as possible)**

Due to the fact that airline tickets and room reservations must be paid for in advance:

Deposit of \$100 is due with registration

The first payment of \$2,000 is due March 1, 2009 (Single occupancy \$2,000)

The final payment of \$1,100 is due April 1, 2009 (Single occupancy \$1,500)

For reservations cancelled 45 days prior to departure date 50% of money paid will be refunded. Cancellations after that time - payments are non-refundable.

We ask that this trip not be used as a vehicle of proselytizing. There is a difference between proselytizing and evangelizing. Proselytizing is attempting to target and force someone to change for which they made no request. It is usually accompanied by derogatory, inflammatory, or demeaning comments about their current "spiritual status." Evangelizing is answering a request for information and is usually explaining about one's own beliefs, as in the verse: "Always be ready to give an answer when asked for the hope within you with meekness and respect" 1Peter 3:15. Remember the words of St. Francis of Assisi, "Go everywhere preaching the Good News, if necessary use words."

Trip Participants Under the Age of 18

If you are under the age of 18 we will need a signed, notarized letter stating who will be responsible for you during your time in Israel. The letter will need to be received at the Road to Zion Office no later than May 1, 2009.

If you are under the age of 18 a parent or guardian must sign below agreeing to be responsible for the cost of your trip.

Dress Code

We request participants to wear modest clothing while in Israel. For women, skirts can be no shorter than knee length, top or blouses must cover the mid section. No short shorts, mini skirts, halter tops or tank tops. Only one day or two – when touring the Dead Sea – would shorts be acceptable. So please bring capris, blue jeans or skirts for the other days.

When touring, many churches and religious sites require long pants or skirts and do not allow sleeveless tops. Shorts are not permitted for men or women at most religious sites. If we are **NOT** working in Orthodox homes modest shorts can be worn while working. We will give you a work schedule two weeks before leaving so you will know what type of homes we are working in. Please bring old clothes for work days – clothing you would not mind getting paint on.

Friday night is the beginning of the Sabbath in Israel. We will either be having a nice meal at the hotel or enjoying a Sabbath meal in the home of an Israeli family. You will need a nice outfit for the occasion.

Nights in Jerusalem might be cool. You may want to bring a jacket or sweater. If you are not clear about what clothing to bring please contact us. We will be glad to answer your questions.

General Terms and Conditions

Road to Zion requires all interested participants to complete an application and return it to the Road to Zion Office. All applications will be reviewed by the tour leadership team - looking for those that would best fit on this special ministry team. If for any reason your application is not accepted, your deposit will be returned in full. A deposit must be accompanied by a completed application mailed to Road to Zion Ministries, 8001 Eastwood Lane, Pensacola, FL 32514.

Passport, Airline and identification Security

Every tour participant must be in possession of a current (at least 6 months until expiration) passport. No visa is required of U.S. citizens for entry into Israel.

Trip Insurance

Optional insurance coverage for trip cancellation and medical expenses is offered through AAA and other businesses. It is recommended each participant consider said coverage to avoid penalties assessed if one has to cancel their trip. The right is reserved to decline to accept or to decline to retain any person as a member of any tour should such person's health, actions or general deportment impede the operation of the tour or the rights or welfare or enjoyment of other passengers. Road to Zion Ministries reserves the right to cancel or change itineraries, or substitute services without notice.

You may have noticed the "o" missing from the name of G-d in this application. To honor His holy name, Jewish people refrain from adding the "o" when writing the name of G-d. We have chosen to respect their tradition by doing the same.
